It will be very warm outside, and I do not want to heat up the house.

So, move outside to the grill.

Tossed salad

Mixed fancy greens Tear drop tomatoes

Croutons Diced apples

Dried cranberries Fresh raspberries

Chopped Pecans Ken's raspberry pecan dressing

Toss all together and serve.

Barbequed Teriyaki Chicken

4 to 6 chicken breasts 1 bottle teriyaki marinade

Place the chicken and the marinade into a gallon bag and put into refrigerator. Let it marinade for at least 2 hours. Place on bar-b-que, medium heat turning several times.

Barbequed Asparagus

6-7 spears per person

Balsamic vinaigrette dressing

Clean asparagus and place in gallon baggie, pour in the dressing, just enough to coat all the spears. Let marinade for about 1 hour. Open the baggie a little, just enough to let steam out. Place asparagus into microwave for about 1-1/2 to 2 minutes. Then take them to the bar-b-que and cook them on medium heat until they have grill marks, turning every minute or so.

Lime Jell-O pie

1-3oz. package lime Jell-o 1-8oz. carton cool whip

2/3 cups boiling water 2 cups ice cubes

1-8- or 9-inch chocolate crumb crust

Prepare this pie the night before. Bring water to a boil. Pour Jell-o into a large bowl and add 2/3 cups boiling water. Mix until dissolved. Place the ice cubes into the bowl and stir until the Jell-o starts to get thick, remove the ice cubes, (there will be very little ice cubes left to remove). Now add the cool whip and stir with spoon or wire whip. Pour into the crust and put into the refrigerator.
