CHICKEN BREAST VERONIQUE

2 chicken breasts (boneless, skinless)	Salt
3 Tbls. butter	1Tbls. orange marmalade
½ teaspoon tarragon, crumbled	¼ cup white grape juice
8 medium-size mushrooms, fluted*	¼ cup whipping cream
¾ cups seedless grapes	Parsley sprigs

Sprinkle chicken lightly with salt. Melt 1 tablespoon of the butter in wide frying pan over medium heat. Add chicken breasts and cook until golden on each side. Stir in marmalade, tarragon, and grape juice. Cover and simmer for about 15 minutes or until meat is no longer pink when slashed in thickest part. Transfer to warm serving dish. Meanwhile, melt remaining 2 tablespoons butter in a small pan, over medium heat. Add mushrooms and cook, stirring, until liquid evaporates. To chicken pan juices add cream and quickly bring to a full rolling boil. Mix in grapes, return to a boil, and then pour sauce over chicken. Garnish with sautéed mushrooms and parsley sprigs. *Fluted-shallow cuts on top of mushroom, resembling pie slices.

Raspberry salad

1 bag fancy mixed greens	Diced apples
Cran-raisins	Tear drop tomatoes
Cinnamon-sugar pecans, chopped	Croutons
Raspberry vinaigrette dressing	

Layer all ingredients in order on a salad plate and drizzle the dressing.

Peach Cobbler-Patty Koch

8 cups peaches	2 Tbsp. butter	1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup brown sugar		1-1/2 tsp. cinnamon
3 tsp. lemon juice	2 tsp. corn starch	
<u>Crust:</u> 2 cups flour	1 cup sugar	
1 cup brown sugar	1/4 tsp. salt	2 tsp. baking powder
1 Tbsp. Vanilla	2 sticks butter, melted	

Heat oven to 400 degrees. Place 2 Tbsp. butter in 9x13 pan. Melt in oven, mix remaining ingredients and pour on top of melted butter. Bake 15 minutes. Meanwhile, mix together the crust until it resembles dough like batter. With your hands crumble batter on top of fruit. Bake in 400° oven for about 30-35 minutes or until golden brown. Let sit for about 10-15 minutes. Top with ice cream or whip cream.
