. Hawaiian Chicken Kebabs

Serves 9-10 kebabs

1/3 cup ketchup1/3 packed dark brown sugar1/3 cup soy sauce½ cup canned pineapple juice2 Tablespoon olive oil1-1/2 tablespoon rice vinegar4 garlic cloves (minced-4 teaspoons)1 Tablespoon minced ginger

½ teaspoon sesame oil salt and pepper

1-3/4 pounds chicken breast-diced 3 cups fresh cubed pineapple

1-1/2 green peppers, diced 1 large red onion-diced

Dice chicken, peppers, onions, pineapple in 1-1/4-inch cubes.

Marinade: In a bowl whisk ketchup, brown sugar, soy sauce, pineapple juice, 2 Tablespoons olive oil, vinegar, garlic, ginger and sesame oil. Stir in salt and pepper. Place chicken in a gallon size resealable bag. Reserve ½ cup of the marinade and place in refrigerator. Pour remaining marinade in the bag with chicken. Refrigerate 1-2 hours in refrigerator. Soak wooden skewer sticks in water for 1 hour. Put the diced bell pepper, onion, and pineapple in a bowl and toss with 2 tablespoon olive oil, then season with salt and pepper. Start threading onion, bell peppers, chicken and pineapple.

Preheat grill over medium heat to 400 degrees. Brush grill with olive oil, place skewers on grill and grill for 5 minutes. Turn and brush with remaining marinade and grill for 4 minutes longer.

Continue this method until chicken reads 165 degrees.

My Country Tis of Thee by Samuel Francis Smith 1808-1895

Samuel Smith was one of the outstanding Baptist preachers and patriots of the past century. He composed approximately 150 hymns over his lifetime. He was given a copy of the German patriotic poem "God Bless Our Native Land" and it inspired him to write a song for America. Though the text of this hymn is distinctly American, the tune is an international one. The most popular being "God Save the Queen/King" of England but it is also found in Sweden, Germany, and Russia. On the 4th of July, a children's Sunday School choir sang it in a local park and it caught on. This was considered to be the best-loved patriotic hymn.

- Vs. 1 My country 'tis of thee, sweet land of liberty, of thee I sing. Land where my fathers died, land of the pilgrims pride, from every mountain side, let freedom ring.
- Vs. 2 My native country, thee, land of the noble free, Thy name I love. I love Thy rocks and rills, Thy woods and templed hills, my heart with rapture thrills like that above.
- Vs. 3 Let music swell the breeze, and ring from all the trees sweet freedom's song; Let mortal tongues awake, let all that breathe partake; let rocks their silence break, the sound prolong.
- Vs. 4 Our father's God to Thee, Author of liberty, to Thee we sing; Long may our land be bright with freedom's holy light; protect us by Thy might, Great God, our King!
