Hawaiian Chicken Kebobs

Serves 9-10 kebobs

1/3 cup ketchup	1/3 packed dark brown sugar
1/3 cup soy sauce	¼ cup canned pineapple juice
2 Tablespoon olive oil	1-1/2 Tablespoon rice vinegar
4 garlic cloves	1 Tablespoon minced ginger
½ teaspoon sesame oil	salt and pepper
1-3/4 pounds chicken breast-diced	
3 cups fresh cubed pineapple	
Bell peppers (all colors), diced	1 large red onion-diced

Dice chicken, peppers, onions, pineapple in 1-1/4-inch cubes.

Marinade: In a bowl whisk ketchup, brown sugar, soy sauce, pineapple juice, 2 Tablespoons olive oil, vinegar, garlic, ginger and sesame oil. Stir in salt and pepper. Place chicken in a gallon size resealable bag. Reserve ½ cup of the marinade and place in refrigerator. Pour remaining marinade in the bag with chicken. Refrigerate 1-2 hours in refrigerator. Soak wooden skewer sticks in water for 1 hour. Put the diced bell pepper, onion, and pineapple in a bowl and toss with 2 tablespoon olive oil, then season with salt and pepper. Start threading onion, bell peppers, chicken and pineapple.

Preheat grill over medium heat to 400 degrees. Brush grill with olive oil, place skewers on grill and grill for 5 minutes. Turn and brush with remaining marinade and grill for 4 minutes longer.

Continue this method until chicken reads 165 degrees

Add a salad, Hawaiian Rolls and a Hot Fudge Sundae.
