Grilled Kabobs

1-pound cubed beef or chicken, Italian sausage, or all 1-inch cubes of vegetables: bell peppers all colors, onions, yellow squash, Italian squash, cherry tomatoes, whole mushrooms, pineapple, etc Teriyaki marinade Long kabob sticks (wooden or metal) Cube all ingredients and place in bag. Pour marinade into bag and let set in refrigerator for 30-60 minutes. Take out of refrigerator and pour into large bowl, reserve the marinade. Start piercing each piece onto sticks alternating with the vegetables and meat. Place on medium heat grill, turn every 3-5 minutes, baste with leftover marinade, and grill until meat is done, approximately 15-20 minutes.

Broccoli Slaw

package chicken ramen noodles 1 package broccoli coleslaw mix 2 cups sliced green onions 1-1/2 cups broccoli florets 1 can (6 ounces) ripe olives, drained and halved 1 cup sunflower kernels, toasted 1/2 cup slivered almonds, toasted 1/2 cup Sugar 1/2 cup cider vinegar 1/2 cup olive oil Set aside the noodle seasoning packet; crush the noodles and place in a large bowl. Add the slaw mix, onions, broccoli, olives, sunflower kernels and almonds. In a jar with a tight-fitting lid, combine the sugar, vinegar, oil and contents of seasoning packet; shake well. Drizzle over salad and toss to coat. Serve immediately.

After a very successful career of writing secular music, Thompson turned his talents to writing gospel hymns. Later he started his own publishing and music store business in Illinois. His business earned him a sizable income in his lifetime, yet he was always known as a kind, quiet and unassuming Christian gentleman, greatly loved and admired by his associates. Thompson was also known for his travels by horse and buggy from one small community to the next throughout Ohio singing his songs to people everywhere. He was also a personal friend of D.L. Moody. This particular hymn was one of Moody's favorites.

Vs. 1 Softly and tenderly Jesus is calling, calling for you and for me. See on the portals He's waiting and watching, watching for you and for me.
