Dinner does not get any easier than this 7 can chicken taco soup! Dump 7 cans into a pot, plus some seasonings and that's it! Serve with tortilla chips, cheese, and sour cream.

Chicken breast	1 can Black beans
1 can sweet corn	1/2 tsp Garlic powder
1 can Pinto beans	1 can Tomatoes, petite
1 can Chicken broth	1 can Enchilada sauce, green
1/2 tsp Chili powder	1 packet Taco seasoning
1/2 tsp Cumin	



Hot Fudge Brownie

1-1/2 cup flour	1-1/2 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon baking soda	1/4 cup water
1/2 cup teaspoon salt	2 teaspoons vanilla
1 package semi-sweet chocolate chips	4 eggs
2/3 cup butter or margarine	1 cup chopped nuts



Preheat oven to 325 degrees. In small bowl, combine flour, baking soda and salt; set aside. In medium saucepan, combine butter, sugar and water, bring just to a boil. When you see bubbles on side it is done, continue to stir to melt any unmelted butter and remove from heat. Add chocolate chips and vanilla; stir until melted and smooth. Add eggs, one at a time mixing well after each addition. Gradually blend in flour mixture. Stir in nuts. Spread into a greased 9x13 baking pan. Bake at 325 degrees for 50 minutes. **Temperature and bake time are crucial.** Serve warm with a scoop of ice cream, hot fudge and whip cream

Be a Doer

BE A DOER James 1:22 *“But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves”.*

On Monday mornings we are studying in the book of James. I constantly repeat each week the importance of being in God’s Word daily. In chapter 1 of James, it says we need to be doers not just hearers. What does it mean to be a doer of the Word? It means that we need to be reading the Word, living the Word, speaking the Word and doing the Word. When we read God’s Word, we need to meditate on what we have read and practice what God’s Word says. We also need to be living God’s Word. Are you living God’s Word or just merely reading it to get the satisfaction in that you are in God’s Word? In **2 Corinthians 3:2–3** *it says, “You are our epistle written in our hearts, known and read by all men; 3 clearly you are an epistle of Christ, ministered by us, written not with ink but by the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of flesh, that is, of the heart”.* In 1983 I became a widow and my friends who later became widows themselves said to me we have been watching you. That hit me like a brick, and I thought what did they see? What they heard and saw in me may have been the only contact to the knowledge of who God is and how He loves them also. Ladies we need to be doers of the Word. We must show those who know us and are watching us that we are doers of God’s Word not just hearers. There is an old saying; in one ear and out the other! **Matthew 5:16 (NKJV)** *“Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven”.*

Count Your Blessings by Johnson Oatman, Jr. 1856-1922

Count Your Blessings is generally considered to be Oatman’s finest hymn. It has been sung all over the world. One writer has stated, “Like a beam of sunlight it has brightened up the dark places of the earth.” During the Great Revival in Wales it was one of the hymns sung at every service.

Vs. 1 When upon life’s billows you are tempest tossed, when you are discouraged, thinking all is lost, Count your many blessings name them one by one, and it will surprise you what the Lord hath done.

Chorus: Count your blessings name them one by one; Count your blessings see what God hath done; Count your blessings, name them one by one; Count your many blessings see what God hath done.

Vs. 2 Are you ever burdened with a load of care? Does the cross seem heavy you are called to bear? Count your many blessings every doubt will fly, and you will be singing as the days go by.

Vs. 3 When you look at others with their lands of gold, think that Christ has promised you His wealth untold; Count your many blessings money cannot buy your reward in heaven nor your home on high.

Vs. 4 So amid the conflict, whether great or small, do not be discouraged God is over all; Count your many blessings angels will attend, help and comfort give you to your journey’s end.
